	Attend a mandatory Nursing Information Session. All Information Sessions will be held in the Health Sciences Building (J Building) on the main campus. Check the BCC Nursing Website for dates and times of the sessions. To accommodate work, school, and life schedules of perspective students, dates and times will vary from session to session.
	Submit ALL official educational transcripts (high school & college) and/or AP, CLEP, to Student Services. Verify transcript evaluation has occurred through your personal Self-Service account. If an anticipated course is not listed, please follow up with Student Services.
	GPA requirement: GPA 2.5 or higher at current institution to submit application.

	TOEFL iBT – Complete English Language proficiency exam if: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><input type="checkbox"/> English is not your native or first language.<input type="checkbox"/> If you did not graduate from a high school in the US.<input type="checkbox"/> Applicants must score 20 or higher on each section of the TOEFL iBT.
	Complete the LPN to ADN Transition Nursing program application and submit all supporting documents by 3 pm on January 31, 2025. IMPORTANT: Any application or supporting documents received after the deadline will not be considered and eligibility will be forfeited. It is the nursing applicants’ responsibility to ensure that all requirements are met by the established deadline. Nursing deadlines, guidelines, and policies apply equally to all students; therefore, there can be no exceptions.

LPN to ADN Transition Program Entrance Exam:

Following successful completion and submission of LPN to ADN Application, applicants who meet the minimum requirements will be scheduled to take the *ATI PN Comprehensive Predictor*. This exam will be used to rank applicants highest to lowest for admission. Applicants with the highest scores will be offered a seat first. The number of applicants accepted into the LPN to ADN Transition Program may vary year to year and will depend on the space available.

The most current version of the *ATI PN Comprehensive Predictor* will be administered. This entrance exam will be administered on the BCC Campus during the first week of April. Specific dates and instructions for registering for the exam will be provided via email following acceptance of applications. Applicants may take the *PN Comprehensive Predictor* once during an application period.

Full Acceptance is Contingent Upon:

Notification of acceptance, waitlist, or denial will come via the BCC AVISO Watermark and email during the month of April. Full acceptance is contingent upon maintaining eligibility requirements.

Criminal background check, drug screen, and immunization documentation required. Students may be dismissed from the program prior to, or during the program if the student does not meet the clinical agency requirements. Any student who tests positive for an illegal or illegally obtained controlled substance will be dismissed from the Nursing Program and will be prohibited from reapplying to any Brunswick Community College Nursing Program in the future.

A mandatory orientation will be scheduled in March or April prior to the start of Summer semester. Students who do not attend the orientation session will forfeit their seat in the nursing program.

If any changes arise involving BCC's ability to adhere to the information contained above, BCC reserves the right to make changes and will make every possible effort to communicate changes to applicants in a timely manner.**
